A Vision of Growth

Vision for children's education v discipleship.

Without vision, we are satisfied with status quo. There is no impetus to grow, and little or no risks are taken. We amble along, without a compass.

With vision, we can regularly adjust our course, we venture much more, we can regroup from time to time, and we push forward with renewed enthusiasm – in a specific and purposeful direction.



The Church's Essential Mission – Disciple-Making / Evangelization

The Church "exists in order to evangelize", and the "task of evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church." (Pope St. Paul VI, <u>Evangelii Nuntiandi</u>, 14).

"Evangelization takes place in obedience to the missionary mandate of Jesus: 'Go therefore and **make disciples** of all nations...' [Matt 28:19-20]" (Evangelii Gaudium, 19).

Making disciples is inseparably connected with evangelization – it is the very reason why the Church exists.

- To baptized (New Evangelization)



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

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2. Initial Catechetical Activity

(a.k.a. Initial Catechesis)

- Comprehensive and systematic.
- · An apprenticeship of the entire Christian life.
- Promotes an authentic following of Christ.
- Helps the disciple to transform the old man in order to assume his baptismal responsibilities and to profess the faith from the heart.
- Centred on what constitutes the nucleus of Christian experience, the most fundamental certainties of the faith, and the most essential evangelical values.

Fundamental characteristics of initial catechesis (GDC, 67)



2. Initial Catechetical Activity (a.k.a. Initial Catechesis)

Apollos, as a new believer, required the guidance and teaching of older and more mature Christians (Priscilla and Aquila), to understand "the way of God more accurately" (Acts 18:24-26).





2. Initial Catechetical Activity

(a.k.a. Initial Catechesis)

- Possible Topics (<u>Bible</u>, <u>Creed</u>, <u>Eucharist</u> / Mass, <u>History of Salvation</u>, <u>Prayer</u>,
 <u>Sacraments and Worship</u>).

Directed toward the Christian faithful of mature faith in the bosom of the Christian community



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3A. Adherence

Adhering to Jesus Christ is the disciple's process of life-long and continuing conversion or journey towards perfection like and maturity in the fullness of Christ.

See <u>GDC</u>, 56; **Eph 4:13-16**

I.e. Becoming Jesus.





3A. Adherence

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3B. Ongoing Formation (Perfective Catechesis)

• "Ongoing Formation", "Perfective Catechesis", "Permanent Catechesis" (see generally <u>GDC</u>, 51, 69-72)

A "systematic deepening of the Christian message by means of theological instruction, so as truly to educate in the faith, encourage growth in understanding of it and to equip the Christian for giving the reason for his hope in the present world" (GDC, 71).



3B. Ongoing Formation (Perfective Catechesis)

- Possible Topics
 - Repeat, Extend and Deepen Earlier Topics
 - Discipleship
 - <u>M</u>oral Theology
 - <u>N</u>ew Evangelization
 - Opus Dei (Work / various aspects of Catholic Social Teaching)

 - <u>Y</u>esterday (History of Church)
- A-Z of DiscipleSHIP as part of "perfective catechesis".
- Are you regularly and diligently receiving perfective catechesis, as part of a life-long process and culture of learning?



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3C. Missionary Initiative



The missionary success of St. Francis Xavier in Asia was only possible because he had been mentored by his roommate in the University of Paris, St. Ignatius of Loyola.

Initially resistant to his zeal, Francis developed respect for St. Ignatius and became one of the best missionaries the world had ever seen.
